Which crayon made you giggle? Talk with your grown up – how is each crayon feeling? Why?</p> <p>Tuesday: look again at the book. Read the orange and yellow crayon pages. What reasons do they give for being the true colour of the sun? Who do you agree with? What colour do you use to colour the sun? Complete this sentence: <i>I think yellow/orange is the best colour for the sun because....</i></p> <p>Wednesday: look at the book again – use your retrieval (finding) skills to tell your grown up one thing about each crayon. This shows you have understood the story. For example you might say ' Blue crayon is really short because Duncan uses him all the time.'</p> <p>Thursday: answer these questions – which crayon is the saddest and why? Which crayon is the happiest and why?</p> <p>Friday: use a dictionary (online is ok - https://kids.wordsmyth.net/we/) to find the definitions of these words from the story: wheat, ocean, career, cowboy,</p> <p>Writing/SPaG lessons:</p> <p>Monday: SPAG - https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zbpr47h use this BBC</p>	<p>This week's suggested indoor topics are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Art – poor peach crayon doesn't have any clothes on! Maybe the gold crayon is tired from drawing all the stars at night-time? Maybe the silver crayon loves being used for brave knights in shining armour? Draw the page in the book that your crayon helped colour.</p> <p>Thursday: write a postcard to Duncan from your crayon, saying what he uses it for and how the crayon feels about it. For example: <i>Dear Duncan, silver crayon here. Thanks so much for using me to draw the brave knight in shining armour yesterday. Please remember to sharpen me!</i></p> <p>Friday: time to be Duncan! Write back to your crayon as though you are Duncan.
